

Completion deadlines and regulations for Postgraduate Programmes in Clinical Education

Postgraduate Certificate in Clinical Education

Part-time: 2 years (4 semesters) of continuous enrolment (in a specific course within programme)

Full-time: 1 semester

Postgraduate Diploma in Clinical Education

Part-time: 4 years (8 semesters) of continuous enrolment (in a specific course within programme)

Full-time: 1 year (2 semesters)

Masters in Clinical Education (Taught Option)

Part-time: 4 years (8 semesters) of continuous enrolment in a taught master's course

Full-time: 1 year (2 semesters)

Masters in Clinical Education (Research Option)

Part-time: 2 years (4 semesters) of continuous enrolment in either the Thesis or Research Portfolio

Full-time: 1 year (2 semesters) in either the Thesis or Research Portfolio

Extensions

There are no provisions for extensions longer than **one semester** for the PG Certificate in Clinical Education. You will not be able to complete your programme and graduate if this is exceeded.

The Head of the Department and the Senate *may* be able to grant suspensions of two continuous semesters maximum from the PG Diploma and Masters programmes.

If you wish to suspend your enrolment, please inform Peggy Wang (p.wang@auckland.ac.nz) and Jennifer Weller (j.weller@auckland.ac.nz) so that we are aware of your intentions. You must also plan which courses you will undertake following your break, noting their availability, in order to complete the required amount of points in the remaining semesters.

Enrolment withdrawals

Students may withdraw from courses without penalty before the enrolment deadline – usually the end of the second week of the semester.

After this, you may withdraw from a course; however, all course fees remain owing.

It is important to note that the late withdrawals are marked as a 'W' on your academic record and will count towards your total enrolment limit. eg. for the PG Certificate, the enrolment limit is 80 points – a withdrawal would count towards this. You would therefore not be able to make another withdraw or fail any courses to achieve the required 60 points.
