2.2 New staff

The year started with the urgent need to find two replacement staff.

Dr Fiona Moir, Senior Lecturer for the Primary mental health papers, has been awarded a University of Auckland Doctoral Scholarship for 3 years and is starting her PhD full-time in March 2010. Her position has been filled by Dr Tannis Laidlaw on a fixed term contract.

Dr Celeste Gertseema, who was the coordinator of the Sports medicine programme, is also doctor for the All Whites football team, who have qualified for the World Cup. This means Celeste will be spending much of 2010 overseas and she is unable to coordinate the programme this year although she will remain as a lecturer on the course at about 0.1 FTE until a replacement is found. A job description has been prepared and a 0.4 FTE position will be advertised shortly. The remaining 0.1 FTE will remain to be filled by sports medicine registrars on an annual basis.

We wish Fiona well in her PhD, and Celeste in her international travels with the All Whites.

Mrs Cecile Pilkington is now designated the Administrator to the Goodfellow Unit rather than PA to the Director.

3 UPDATE ON PROGRAMMES AND COURSES

3.1 Community emergency medicine programme (PGDipComEmMed)

- Clinical Skills & Organisational Issues in Accident & Medical Practice POPLPRAC 736

This programme currently provides a vocational training pathway for Accident and Medical practitioners, and vocational registration through the Accident and Medical Practitioners Association (AMPA). It will be moving from the position of exit assessment to an entry level qualification for AMPA vocational registration.

It also has relevance to other clinicians including GPs (especially rural GPs), GP registrars, doctors working in hospital settings who are not training under the Australasian College of Emergency Medicine, rural hospital doctors, and specialist nurses working in acute accident and medical settings. Four of the courses are creditable towards the new rural hospital medicine training programme. The programme is designed to be completed part-time over a two, three or four year period. Individual courses have been completed successfully by Sports Medicine doctors and nurses as components of their Postgraduate Diploma and Masters Programmes.

The programme underwent an external review in 2009. The need for some improvements has been identified, including modernisation of the mode of delivery, alignment of purpose, learning outcomes and assessments in

the courses and an increased focus on scholarship and professionalism commensurate with the postgraduate nature of the programme.

3.1.1 Modernisation of the mode of delivery

Over the next two years the large paper course books and DVDs will be replaced by electronic delivery in line with good educational principles. The senior lecturers are working with the University of Auckland library to have the reading resources made electronically available through the LEARN web pages, which should be completed by the end of 2010 and this will continue in 2010.

We have sought the assistance of the Faculty of Medical and Health Science Learning (FMHS) Technology Unit (LTU) for the compilation of Diploma materials. Course material will be modernised and transferred from paper-based handbooks and DVDs to electronic-based formats. Course-builder will be used as the primary means of course delivery.

3.1.2 Alignment of purpose, learning outcomes and assessments

The academic staff along with the Goodfellow Postgraduate Chair will work with the FMHS Centre for Medical and Health Sciences Education (CMHSE) to improve and develop the courses. Initial meetings have already been held with Dr Iain Doherty, Director of LTU, Dr Boaz Shulruf from CMHSE, Dr Mark Barrow, Associate Dean (Education) and Ms Lynley Pritchard (Academic Services Manager) and a strategy is being drafted.

Each course will be reviewed to ensure that the purpose of the course, the learning outcomes expected, the topics covered and the means by which these learning outcomes will be assessed are all clear and aligned. The Goodfellow Postgraduate Chair will work with academic staff to revise the purpose and learning outcomes of each course, which will then be presented to the School of Population Health Postgraduate Board of Studies for their input and approval.

A Curriculum Board for this postgraduate diploma will be convened in 2010. This Board will be responsible for regular review of the curriculum and will meet either in person or via email on a regular basis in 2010 and 2011 until the courses have been revised as outlined.

3.1.3 Increased focus on scholarship and professionalism

The programme imparts skills and knowledge of best practice within its speciality. The review identifies the need for the incorporation of increased scholarship and professionalism. Accident and emergency medicine, as with any clinical discipline, requires a commitment to life-long learning. Postgraduate education needs to ensure that the students have the tools to be access and critically appraise new knowledge as research progresses, to assess the quality of the evidence and its relevance to their own practice and determine whether this learning is practice confirming or practice changing.

The Chair is exploring the introduction of a core course to be completed at the beginning of the programme which covers literature review, critical appraisal, and research methodology to equip students to understand emerging research and assess its value with respect to their own practice. This core course will also include components on ethical decision-making and clinical reasoning. The creation and introduction of such a course is being explored with the School of Population Health Academic Director Dr Janet Clinton, staff from LTU including its Director Iain Doherty, CMHSE, the Associate Dean (Education) and other relevant personnel.

Such a core course will have a basic generic structure but also will be tailored to specific clinical disciplines and different types of health professionals. There is the possibility of developing such a core course on clinical scholarship and professionalism that would also be relevant and applicable to other postgraduate clinical programmes and courses, including sports medicine but also others within the School of Population Health and within the greater Faculty of Medical & Health Sciences. This course would equip the students for completing assignments later in their programme and give them professional skills to be able to understand theoretical underpinnings and to apply knowledge critically to their practice, in keeping with the learning demands of a postgraduate programme.

3.2 Sports medicine programme (PGDipSportMed)

The Sports Medicine programme underwent review in 2007 and has undergone significant improvement since then. All its reading resources are now electronically available through the LEARN web pages.

Once the position of programme coordinator has been filled, the LTU will work with the academic staff to further modernise the delivery using the template provided by the University online tool coursebuilder.

This year one of the assessments is for students to write evidence-based interactive internet quizzes using the GoodfellowClub template (with the best of these published on the GoodfellowClub website). Perrin Rowland has created an articulate presentation (powerpoint with voice-over) to walk students through this assignment. This gives students the opportunity to critically appraise knowledge and develop scenario-based quizzes; student interaction can include pairs of students peer-reviewed each other's work, there is the potential of a published outcome for students and other members of their profession get access to an e-learning resource. I am also exploring research possibilities of this innovative approach in conjunction with Dr Boaz Shulruf, CMHSE.

As with Community Emergency Medicine, the Sports Medicine programme calls for an increased focus on scholarship and professionalism and the proposed generic paper will also fit in well with this course, replacing POPLHLTH 701 - Research Methods in Health as a required core paper.

3.3 Palliative care

Courses may be taken towards health sciences, medical science, and nursing programmes. Due to low enrolments POPLPRAC 724 Child and Adolescent Palliative Care is not offered this semester.

Professor Rod Macleod is a great asset to the Department. As well as developing a new postgraduate course in non-malignant palliative care he supervises a number of masters and doctoral students.

As with Sports Medicine, we are looking at developing interactive quizzes for the Goodfellow Club site as one form of assessment for some of the palliative care courses.

3.4 Sexual health

- POPLPRAC 751 - Sexual Health

This course has been phased out and will be run for a final time this semester with the final 5 students.

- POPLPRAC 758 STIs and Sexual health (possibly to be reassigned with a POPHLTH number)
- POPLPRAC 759 Sexual Health for Advanced Practitioners

These are two new courses proposed to start 2011 to cater for a broader range of practitioners who might need skills in this area. As well as sexual health physicians these could include GPs, family planning doctors and nurses, and clinicians working in secondary and tertiary school clinics.

The Chair will work with the current course coordinator over the next two months to ensure that these courses have clear curricula, and that their purposes, learning outcomes and assignments are aligned and at a suitable postgraduate level.

3.5 Other courses

Other courses run through the Goodfellow Unit and Department of General Practice & Primary Health Care, such as life-style management and primary care nursing, will be reviewed as time permits.
