This comprehensive overview of health status covers ages 0-24 years, and where data permits ethnicity and deprivation analyses are included.

Part 1 focused on health status and the large disparities that often exist between different groups of children and young people. Part 2 brought together information on the underlying determinants of child and youth health from a variety of different sources (e.g. CYFS, the Police, Work and Income, Education), which primarily lie outside of the health sector. Sections of particular relevance to injury prevention include Family Violence and Alcohol Use. Figures 7-11 provide police data on family violence and related injuries.

This research shows that young people feel that gangs, drugs and alcohol accessibility, violence and negative perceptions of young people in Otago are significant issues that face young Otarians. This report is based on the concerns of young people living in Otago, Manukau City.
