This report predicts that road traffic injuries will be one of the most rapidly growing public health concerns over the next 25 years. Deaths due to road traffic crashes are predicted to rise from 1.3 million in 2004 to 2.4 million by the year 2030 and increase from the 9th cause of death in 2004 to the 5th cause in 2030.

Violence is predicted to move up from 22nd to 16th place, and suicide from 16th to 12th place - see: Ten highlights in health statistics - Future trends in global mortality: major shifts in cause of death patterns. The report also includes a table listing age standardised mortality rates for injuries and violence for WHO member countries as well as for children under the age of 5 years.

The major building structural and design components identified as being associated with fall injuries in this study were flooring surfaces, stairs, windows, balconies, verandahs and, indirectly, guttering and roofs in residential settings. As shown by the epidemiological data in this study, many of the victims of fall injuries in buildings are from vulnerable populations, particularly the elderly, the sick and children. This report contains a review of all relevant literature available for the primary structural and design building components outlined above, a thorough analysis of Australian national injury and fatality data pertaining to falls in buildings, estimates of the economic costs of these hospitalisations and deaths and wide ranging recommendations for improvements to the Building Code of Australia.
