This special Innocenti series on Child Injury, developed jointly by UNICEF and TASC, presents recently acquired evidence from surveys in five Asian countries: Bangladesh, China, Philippines, Thailand and Viet Nam. The surveys are large in scale, similar to a census. In total over half a million households and nearly 2.5 million people were surveyed. The scale of the research provides an in-depth view of child mortality from all causes, as well as of morbidity from injury throughout all the years of childhood. The results show in detail the leading contribution made by injury to child death and disability, a fact that has been insufficiently recognized to date. (from the Foreword)
